 - A. **Bills to Consider**
 - i. SB 991 Residential care facilities for the elderly: categorization of citations. This bill requires the State Department of Social Services, when it confirms a violation in a residential care facility for the elderly that constitutes abuse, to categorize that abuse using the specific definitions found in the Elder Abuse and Dependent Adult Civil Protection Act, which includes types of abuse like physical abuse, financial abuse, neglect, and mental suffering. These categorized abuse types will then be clearly listed on any public database maintained by the department that display information about facility licensing, enforcement, or transparency, ensuring that the public is informed about the specific nature of substantiated abuse violations.

ii. AB 2037 Wildfire Mitigation Aging and Disability Grant Program. This bill establishes the Wildfire Mitigation Aging and Disability Grant Program, to be administered by the California Department of Aging, which will award grants to seniors and individuals with disabilities to help them protect their homes from wildfires, especially in areas identified as having a high fire risk by CalFire. The program is intended to assist those who cannot afford wildfire mitigation measures on their own properties, which are their primary residences, and the grants can be used to hire contractors for activities like clearing vegetation, removing hazardous trees, cleaning debris, and installing fire-resistant features. Implementation of this program is contingent upon the Legislature appropriating funds for it.

iii. AB 2283 State Public Guardian. This bill, the State Public Guardian Act, proposes to establish a new State Public Guardian position within the State Department of Social Services, contingent on legislative appropriation, to support county public guardians and public conservators. The State Public Guardian's duties will include offering guidance and technical assistance to ensure local guardians comply with state and federal laws, facilitating access to necessary training and continuing education materials, and reviewing existing policies to recommend legislative changes. The bill also aims to develop a standardized referral form for requesting guardianship or conservatorship and explore a unified reporting system to identify and address caseload management issues.

iv. AB 2414 Developmental services: direct support professionals. This bill proposes to change the terminology for individuals who provide direct care to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities from "direct service professionals" to "direct support professionals" and defines this role as someone employed by a regional center-funded provider who spends at least 50% of their time on direct support tasks. A key provision is the requirement for the State Department of Developmental Services (DDS) to develop billing guidance by April 1, 2027, to facilitate a pay differential for these professionals, contingent on funding being allocated in the annual budget.
